While there are approximately 750 homicides each year in the workplace, there are estimated to be at least 2,000,000 assaults annually. This data suggests that employers must develop violence prevention programs to address these incidents. This program will discuss how to develop the Policies, Reporting Systems, Behavioral Threat Management Team functions and Program Structures which are the foundation to implement an effective Company Violence Prevention System. It will conclude by defining protective strategies to employ during Active Shooter events.
